These are the findings of an Ipsos Reid poll conducted on behalf of the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives between March 12, 2006. The poll is based on a randomly selected sample of 803 adult British Columbians. With a sample of this size, the results are considered accurate to within ± 3.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what they would have been had the entire adult population of British Columbia been polled. The margin of error will be larger within regions and for other sub-groupings of the survey population. These data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional and age/sex composition reflects that of the actual British Columbia population according to the 2001 Census data.
